### **Chris Pilsbury**

Most of you reading this will probably know the basics of my background- and be able to guess at why I am standing once more for the Board of CFU- as I have been the Chairman of Chester FC/CFU since the Club's formation. I'd now like to put myself forward for a further three years of service to the Club.

During my time on the Board, Chester FC has accomplished many things. We have won consecutive titles, and, when I'm writing this, we are top of Conference North. I think that the Club continues to need an individual on its Board who can essentially act as a full time member of staff, and I think that I am ideally placed for that role.

There is still much to do at the Club. We need our own training facilities, which will also provide us with more opportunities to undertake community work. We need to extend the Blues Bar, to cater for our supporters in the way which they rightly demand. And we need to set up structures which enable us to turn professional after promotion to Conference National. With a further term on the Board, I would seek to drive forward all of these initiatives. After only three years, I see my work at the Club as still beginning, rather than ending, and would hope that members of CFU continue to believe in me, and what I have to offer to the club.

It has been a great honour and privilege to serve Chester FC/CFU, and I hope to do so for another three years.

- Communication and involvement of our members
  Our members need to feel fully informed and engaged with the Club. Our volunteers can and want to do much more.
- Development of our Community role I hold the Community Portfolio on the Board and we have just established the Community Trust. This is central to reaching out to the wider community and building our profile. I have been successful in winning just under £100,000 for the Club in grants. But we need to do more. It is going to take effort and resources. I would love the chance to continue this work.
- Professionalise how we operate
  A supporter run club means we have to be more professional, not less. We need to invest in training, systems and support so that all aspects of the Club are run to the highest standards.

I know of some excellent candidates standing. Each CFU member will make up their own mind, but I believe that Tony Durkin, Steve Ashton and Mark Howell in particular would significantly enhance the existing Board.

We need to have a much more active CFU element to the club. Any decisions that can realistically be made by members should be and there needs to be a proper accountability mechanism for the decisions that have to be made by the Board. We need to improve our communication so that members feel more affinity with their club and a more proactive fund raising policy that harnesses the talents and abilities of the membership. Volunteers are a vital part of what we are trying to do at the club but there is still a lot to be done to make best use of this capacity.

I believe very firmly in financial prudence and discipline and that a strong position with healthy financial reserves is a must for continued success on the pitch. Investing in our own youth system is also vital for the future, as are our own training facilities.

I believe that I have gained valuable experience over the past three years that I can use to continue contributing to building the sort of football club that the vast majority of supporters would like to see. Working with people in a constructive, professional manner and respecting the opinions of others are important to me.

It has been a privilege to contribute to what has been achieved so far and hope that members will let me have the chance to continue to do so.
